What Are Signs That Your Child Might Be At Risk Online?

1. Your child spends large amounts of time online, especially at night.
2. You find pornography on your child's computer.
3. Your child or anyone in the household has received child pornography.
4. Your child has been sexually solicited by someone who knows that your child is under 18 years of age.
5. Your child has received sexually explicit images from someone who knows your child is under the age of 18.

What Should You Do If You Suspect Your Child Is Communicating With A Sexual Predator Online:

- Consider talking openly with your child about your suspicions. Tell them about the dangers of computer-sex offenders.
- Review what is on your child's computer. If you don't know how, ask a friend, coworker, relative, or other knowledgeable person. Pornography or any kind of sexual communication can be a warning sign.
